Dear Parents and Carers

As we have limited space whilst based at Cheadle Hulme Primary School, we have to limit attendance to one parent per student. We anticipate that your son or daughter will attend with you and they should wear their school uniform. We hope you will find the evening useful and informative.

Electives

Due to the Meet the Form Tutor and Open Evenings next week, there will be no Electives on Monday and Thursday. School will end for all students on those two days at 3.45pm.

Uniform

We are very proud of how smart our students are so thank you for your support with this. Please note that all students should wear a jumper or cardigan after the October half-term, it will be compulsory from that time onwards. Students wearing trousers should wear a jumper and those wearing a skirt, the cardigan. If your child wears a skirt they should wear tights as per our uniform policy which can be found on the school website.

School Meals

If your child purchases a school meal or is entitled to a school meal, you may be expecting them to only spend £2.20 per day. This is the amount allocated for a free school meal and is the cost of the daily meal deal. The meal deal includes the hot meal, bottle of water and a piece of cake or fruit. The juice is not included in the meal deal. All of the items have to be purchased together to qualify for the meal deal. If the items are purchased separately the cost will be higher.

Please note that a student who qualifies for a free school meal will have some of their allowance deducted if they buy food at break. This means they may not have enough money left to buy their lunch.

You can check what your child buys at school on the ParentPay system. The itemised purchases can be found by looking at the Menus and Choices section. It does seem to always state lunchtime activity but if you look at which items have been bought, you will be able to tell if it was lunchtime or break.

Celebrations

It has been wonderful to celebrate the achievements of a number of our students already this term with the awarding of house points, praise postcards, badges and now roles of responsibility with House Captains, Sports captains and Student Librarians. The standard of applications for these roles has been very high and there will be more opportunities as the year progresses. This morning the students were issued with a couple of poetry challenges – to identify some lines of poetry and to write their own poem. I can't wait to see who is rewarded in our next assembly!
