Year 11 Teacher Predicted Grades for Autumn Term 1 which included a comparison versus Year 10 Summer Teacher Predicted Grades were presented to the AC. Attendance Attendance continues to be a concern nationally, however the attendance percentage is above the national average and currently second in the Stockport Borough. NT Q: Are any specific days a problem? JP A: There isn't a pattern and we continue to review attendance data versus last year. We do have a very small cohort of around 5% who are persistently absent.
